"I seriously became interested in wine when I came to the UK about 36 years ago and went to a number of wine bars and thought this was a charming way to spend one's life.

"When travelling with ITN, particularly in France, and much later in America, I think it is very difficult to go out there without acquiring an interest in wines and, principally, to discover new types of wine.

"When visiting Australia, what really fascinated me was these so called younger countries. I was amazed as to how brilliantly they had acquired the expertise to produce very fine wines.

"I remember sitting in a restaurant in Sydney one lunchtime looking out at this marvellous scene with the Opera House one side, the bridge the other

"Occasionally I do look in shops for wine as I am always reading more and more about them – particularly New World wines.

"I spent quite a lot of time working in South Africa many years ago and it was wonderful to sample their wine and to read about the emergence of Chilean wines.

"I sometimes buy stuff which does not live up to expectations but I keep on trying! I have a lot of friends who have the same passion about wine as I do and we trade our notes about good wine and talk about it endlessly.

"If I was marooned on a desert island I would have to have endless quantities of vintage champagne!

"I am not a great cook so I do the

and a thousand small boats whilst drinking Houghtons White Burgundy with cricketer Roger Tolchard, the Leicestershire and England wicket-keeper, and I said: "I think we have died and gone to heaven!"

So what is in the fridge?

"I love great French burgundies particularly Meursault – and I love champagne, especially Laurent Perrier, Dom Perignon, Taittinger and Veuve Clicquot.

"Sometimes I buy by the case, mostly in bulk, as there are a lot of fine wine shippers I buy from. One of my favourite red burgundies is the 1998 Charmes Chambertin, Domaine Dujac.

"I have always loved travelling and for many years part of the great fun has been finding out about the local wines and trying them.

"One of my greatest discoveries was when I found how good some American wine is. My great ambition is to go on a holiday to Napa Valley and travel through the vineyards.

"One of my great memories is of a time ago travelling from San Francisco to Santa Monica – sampling Russian

wine side – I discovered a lot of Italian wines on a walking holiday in Italy, wines such as Brunello di Montalcino."

"I began following cricket as a child – neighbours and friends took me to Test matches and then I had the good fortune to report on cricket on radio in WI and television over here.
